December '81, 41 Members were present. After the swapping session amongst the members the meeting was called to order. Shri V. N. S. Then at the request of Shri V. N. S. Rau, Smt. Ramanujam gave a brief talk on how she was instrumental in popularising this hobby in Coimbatore. She offered her services for the SIPA in its efforts to propagate and spread the hobby among the youngsters.

Then Shri G. Madanmohan Das, Vice President of our Association, gave his impressions about the workshop on Philately conducted by the Posts & Telegraphs Department and how he was impressed by the enthusiasm and keen interest shown by the students. He was hopeful that South India Philatelists' Association also would take steps to conduct classes to juniors with the help of the Senior Philatelists like Smt Ramanujam.

# Tamil Nadu Philatelic Exhibition

Tamil Nadu Philatelic Exhibition — 'TANAPEX-81' was inaugurated by Shri C. M. Stephen, Minister for communications, Government of India on 24th Dec. 1981, at Dharmaprakash, Madras. The exhibition was kept open to the public from 24 Dec. to 27 Dec. 1981. There were 231 participants in the competitive groups in addition to the special invitees under non-competitive section. Totally 500 number of frames were under display.

For each of the first three days of the four day TANAPEX-81, special first day covers were issued and special cancellations were provided.

The first day was observed as communications day. Shri C. M. Stephen released the special cover which was on the theme of communications, and with the illustration of Bhaskara II Satelite. The cancellation showed a telephone. The cover also carried one couplet from Bharati's song (in Tamil and English) appropriate to the theme. Shri K. C. Ramadass. General Manager, Madras Telephones received the first cover.

A beautiful Souvenir with a blow-up of Bharati Stamp (issued in 1960) printed on its cover page, containing many interesting articles was also released during the occasion.

In his inaugural speech Shri C. M. Stephen said that a stamp on Bharati could not be released during the centenary celebrations as the Philatelic Advisory Committee had decided that no personality could be honoured a second time through a commemorative stamp and that P & T Dept. had to be content with

honouring the national poet by printing his famous couplets on special cover.

While complementing the Tamil Nadu Circle of the Posts & Telegraph Department, the Minister said that it was because Philately had taken deep roots in Tamil Nadu and boys and girls were keenly interested in this king of hobbies that the State of Tamil Nadu was choosen for conducting philately workshops; a pilot scheme on experimental basis to develop the hobby among the youth.

The second day 25th Dec. 1981 saw the release of the special cover which was on the theme of India's Industrial development, with the illustration of the panoramic view of BHEL. Trichy. The cancellation provided on that day showed two teethed wheels. The special cover was released by Shri V. S. Chakrapani, General Manager (Admn.) BHEL. Trichirapalli and Shri C. Ramachandran, Commissioner and Secretary, Industries Department, Government of Tamil Nadu received the first cover.

At 11-00 a.m. a painting competition for school children in the age group of 7 and 12 years was held.

At 3-00 p.m. a Seminar on "Philately and Junior Collectors - growth and pitfalls" was held. Some of the leading philatelists took part with Shri N. K. Verma, Dy. Director General (Phil) P & T Directorate as Moderator. (A note on the general points discussed: as observed by Shri C. S Sankaranarayanan, one of the life members of SIPA is published elsewhere in this issue)

The theme on December 26 was 'Glory of womanhood' and the special cover was with the illustration of sculpture of Rati Devi at the Krishnapuram Temple in Tirunelveli District. the cancellation showed a bird feeding its young. The special cover was relesed by Smt. Santi Sadiq Ali and Smt. C. K. Gariyali, Collector of Madras received the first cover. Dr. Sathiavani Muthu, M.P. presided over the function.

At 3-00 p.m. a quiz programme was conducted among the students in the age group of 12 and 17 years.

Another important aspect of the day as for SIPA is concerned was the buffet hosted by its President Shri V N. S Rau for all the Philatelists, at the premisses of Shri K. Ramamoorthy.

### Workshop on Philately (Contd. Page 1)

Shri D. Parthasarathy, Director of Postal Services (Head Quarters) Tamil Nadu circle, delivered the welcome address. In his speech he pointed out that the inaugural function of the first ever workshop on philately coincided with the celebration of the children's day. He informed the gathering that the P & T Board had selected the Tamil Nadu circle for conducting philately workshop on as experimental basis, and that the first philatelic workshop in Madras city would be in three sessions (ie, on 14th. 21st and 28th of Nov.—Saturdays). He said that the P & T Dept. hoped to conduct similar workshops outside Madras in places like Trichy, Madurai and Coimbatore also in the near future.

Dr. K. Venkatasubramanian, Director of School Education, while inaugurating the Philatelic workshop appreciated the posts & Telegraphs Department for its efforts in promoting philately among the school children. He also dwelt on the usefulness of the hobby and sincerely expressed the need to introduce it in the school curriculam. He even suggested the necessity of a permanent place to conduct regular courses.

Shri S. D. Kulkarni, Post master. Anna Road H.Q. and convenor of 'workshop on philately', in his speech said that the hobby of philately holds universal appeal and it had always drawn towards it men of all ages from all walks

of life. He expressed his opinion that though there were very many stamp collectors, only a few know how to arrange and study them. He referred to the study of water marks, perforation, types of paper used for printing stamps, their essays, colour proofs etc., and the different branches of philately like postal history, classics and thematic collection. He hoped that the workshop on philately would help the beginners to learn the art of collecting and preserving stamps in a systematic and scientific way.

Then Shri V. N. S. Rau, President South India Philatelists Association, Madras thanked the P & T Department and those responsible for the starting of the philately workshop. He also offered the full co-operation and assistantce of the members of the South India Philatelists Association to the Posts & Telegraph Department, in conducting the Philately workshop.

About 50 students including girls from various schools of Madras city attended the workshop. Some of the leading philatelists like Shri V. N. S. Rau, Shri G. Madan Mohan Das, President and Vice-President respectively & Smt. R. Ramanujam, of the South India Philatelists Association gave lectures and imparted practical training to the students.

At the end of the course the students were awarded certificates of participation by Shri D. Parthasarathy, Director of Postal Services (H.Q.) Madras.

The party numbering more than a hundred included the members of SIPA, visiting philatelists and dealers, was a good get together. Everyone thanked Shri V. N. S. Rau for providing such an opportunity.

There was no special cover and cancellation provided on 27 December : the last day of the exhibition.

At 5-00 p.m. a function was arranged for the distribution of prizes. Shri Sadiq Ali, Governor of Tamil Nadu, while distributing the awards complimented the Posts and Telegraph Dept for showing great imagination in organising the exhibition.

The Corporation Boys Higher Secondary School, Nungambakkam, Madras bagged the first prize for educational institutions and the communications minister's trophy for the best exhibit from schools. Padma Seshadri Bala Bhavan Senior Secondary School and Don Bosco Higher Secondary School (Both Madras) won the second and third prizes respectively.

The Governor of Tamil Nadu Trophy for the best senior entry and the vermeil for the senior category was awarded to Dr. K. S Rao of Chingleput a life member of our Association for his collection on India cancellation. There were several other prizes given to individual participants in both categories. Later Shri P. S. Raghavachari, Post-master General, Tamil Nadu circle distributed mementos to those who have worked for the success of the TANAPEX-81 Exhibition.

### Philately and Junior Collection-growth and Pitfalls

(Shri C. S. Sankaranarayanan, a life member of South India Philatelists' Association furnishes here some of important points that were discussed during the Seminar on Philately and Junior collection-growth and pitfalls.)

Philately: Philately is a good hobby connected with all subjects, It gives an opportunity to the student to study in true perspective. It also persuades him to study philatelic literature and learn postal history etc. The stamp he collects will create inquisitiveness to know about the various currencies, the location of the country in the world map, the country's flora and fauna language and culture of the people, its greatmen and their services. In pursuit of such an interest of the student without any compulsion or pressure gains more knowledge than by mere travelling and reading.

Again collecting and arranging of stamps in an album to his atmost satisfaction helps the student in cultivating in himself the traits in neatness, patience and observation.

Junior Collection: The Junior should make a modest beginning by collecting all the stamps that come to his hands. After collecting a certain quantity he should first classify them countrywise, Then he should assess whether he can take up countrywise collection or select a praticular theme or subject to concentrate and specialise in it. Here the stamp club may play the role of supplying such stamps to him either freely or at a nominal cost.

Growth: The schools can play prominent role in the development of philately among the students by including philately as one of the recognised hobbies. The teachers may be given training in philately workshop by the P&T Department so that they may in turn guide the students.

The parents also should encourage their children in cultivating this hobby. They should allow their children to purchase stamps from the pocket money they get, since the time spent on stamps will not go waste and would rather benefit the children by the knowledge they aquire through it.

Finally the P&T Department may also give a helping hand for the development of philately among the students by arranging to supply used stamps through the schools and by printing and supplying literature at a nominal cost and by conducting philately workshops to students at all centres.

Pitfalls: While making purchase of stamps the student should be very careful. He must first assess the genuineness of the stamps. The quality or condition of the stamps should be checked since demaged stamp will fetch no value and serve no purpose. The attractive and colourful stamps of the Gulf countries like Ajman, Mozambique may draw attention and fleece the student. When he at a later date comes to know that the stamps he purchased were nothing but mere labels, he would get disheartened and lament on his wasteful effort. Consequently he may leave the hobby. Some parents may not be allowing their children to purchase stamps as they may think that the time spent on this hobby would affect their studies, though actually it is the other way round.

Conclusion: The following steps would pave way for the progress of the hobby among the school children

- 1. By forming stamp clubs in schools.
- By conducting philately workshops sponsored by the Posts & Telegraphs Department and local Philatelic Association.
- By advising them to aquire and collect genuine stamps rather than the attractive labels.
- By making available used stamps of all countries at a nominal cost.
- By making available the literature at a nominal cost.
