Madan Mohan Das narrated the proceedings of Philatelic Congress of India General Body Meeting held at Calcutta. He informed that there were several foreign delegates and the deligates were given a red-carpet welcome. The members from Calcutta like Shri D. N. Jatia hosted fabulous dinners. Shri V. N. S. Rau was elected as President-elect and Shri Madan Mohan Das as Assistant Treasurer of the Philatelic Congress of India.

Then Shri G. Madan Mohan Das made announcements about new issues. Shri K. Prasad read out the details of booklets received from the American Topical Association for the benefit of the members. Afterwards Shri G. Madan Mohan Das gave a display talk on the bazaar cards of India and exhorted the members to take up such new and exciting variety of studies on Indian Philately which give wealth of information, He also requested members to bring him any bazaar cards or even photo copies of such cards for the purpose of preparing a comprehensive study on them.

encouraging the growth of philately among the juniors, especially the students.

Shri Ramaswamy explained that Madras was selected as a pilot centre to encourage philately among the students, A philatelic workshop was first conducted at Madras which had a very good response. Similar workshops were subsequently conducted at Coimbatore and Trichinopally with equal response from students. He also informed that it had been proposed to hold similar workshops at Madurai and Tanjore.

Shri G. Madan Mohan Das informed the members, the proposal of PCI to hold one of its quarterly meetings in Madras.

A paper on 'Educational value of stamps' written by Shri AAZER A. Medhora was read by one of the members present and some of the members wanted it printed in the SIPA Bulletin (PI. See SIPA Bulletin. May - June 1982).

June 1982: 23 Members were present. K. Muthuswamy one of the senior members was elected to occupy the chair, After thanking the members for the honour done to him Shri K. Muthuswamy narrated his experience at Asiana-77 at Bangalore where he saw with a dealer sheets and sheets of beautifully printed thematic stamps in low denominations from half cent to five cents of some less populated British Common Wealth Countries like Antigua, Seychelles available at low prices He pointed out and felt unhappy that philatelists are being fleeced by such stamps. He also suggested that when some Arab countries' stamps were discredited in exhibitions these other such issues should also be treated in the same manner.

Shri G. Madan Mohan Das announced new issues He then requested members to give some thought and attention to their investment and accumulation to pursue their hobby in the right direction.

FOR JUNIOR OF ALL AGES

Condition of a stamp: 'Condition' is the physical state of a stamp resulting from the hazards of its life from the moment it was sold over the post office counter until the owner wishes to dispose of it.

The hazards are many The stamp may; (1) be torn; (2) lose a tooth or teeth from the perforated edges (if issued in perforated form); (3) be creased; (4) fade or change colour by exposure to light or atmosphere; (5) get stained by ink, grease etc.; (e) become thinned; (7) lose part of its surface by rough contact; (8) pick up dust and dirt,

Mint: When a stamp is in perfect condition as it came from the post office it is described as Mint. Once a stamp has been hinged it will strictly no longer be mint

Gum: The adhesive matter on the back of the postage stamp as issued. A postage stamp with its gum as issued is referred to some times as with original gum 'or 'O.G.'; if the stamp has lost it O.G. and has had other gum put on, the stamp is referred to as 'regummed.'

Unused and used stamps A stamp which has not been post marked but shows signs of gum disturbance or a stamp whose gum had been removed but never received a cancellation is termed as unused. To describe a stamp as used implies that it has received a postal marking.

Mini - Philatelic Exhibition :

The Post and Telegraph Department is organising a Mini-Philatelic Exhibition at the Anna Salai Post Master General's Office on August 15, 1982.

The exhibition on the theme "India of my dreams" is open to bonafide students up to plus two level from all schools in the city and up to Tambaram

According to Mr. D. Parthasarathy, Director of Postal Services the entrants will be charged one rupee per frame and allowed a maximum of three frames.

The entry forms along with the entrance fee in the form of Postal Orders should reach the Chairman, Prospectus and allotment Committee, P.M.G's Office, Madras-2 by July 24 All entries must be sent through the Heads of institutions. Three prizes will be awarded
